PRINCIPAL'S PEN

The School Bell has a new look! Our goal is to share the same news with you in an updated format. We realize that you will need to become reacquainted with the layout of the School Bell to find the material for which you are looking, but we hope that you enjoy the new arrangement.

Our goal with that update was to provide a more user-friendly and attractive site for our current families and for families who may be considering Sanborn Christian School as a place for their children.

"Today, tomorrow, and forever, I will live for You Today, tomorrow, and forever, I will worship You"

In the first 30 minutes of a school day these words can occasionally be heard coming from the gym and through the hallways as they are sung by our students.

That joyful chorus follows this verse: "Through every trial...through every circumstance...still Your mercy covers me...through every battle...I don't have to understand...Still, I lift my voice and sing."

At school, we've discussed that the life of the follower of God is a battle every day, and one thing the battle requires is faith. We need to trust that the directions and orders we've been given are good and right. We need to put those orders ahead of our own desires and ahead of what we think might be best. For example, the Israelites (an OT picture of God's people today) needed to trust God's battle plan for Jericho. Who would have thought that walking around the walls of the fortified city, shouting and blowing trumpets would be an effective battle strategy? Conversely, Israel's second battle - the battle against Ai - did not result in victory because Israel wasn't obedient to the overall plan of God regarding the plunder of Jericho when Achan put his desires ahead of the community and ahead of what God instructed and took some for himself.

I would guess that we all have stories from our lives that have required acting in faith and trusting what God brought in His providence was the right plan for us. We've probably all wrestled

with putting our desires to the side in order to walk through situations that have come our way. We have all likely struggled with thinking our approach for the future would be a better option than what we think God is orchestrating at the time. Yet, in hindsight, in many of these circumstances, we can conclude that God's way brought about blessings that we didn't see at the time.

These are the "faith stories" that Mrs. Rozenboom and Mrs. Schreur have been trying to compile from our school community in order to share them with our students to illustrate that these stories are not only found in the Bible, but within our own community and families too.

As our students get older, it's important for them to see examples of faith being actively lived, because when you're a kid it can be difficult to make sense of what is being experienced. How can we lift our voices and sing through every trial and circumstance? Is it even possible? It's essential that church / home / school point these things out from the Bible as it is read. It is also good for our students to hear from our own experiences so that we can testify about the goodness and faithfulness of God in our lives - even when it looks bleak.

Even a beginning understanding of this helps us to sing the rest of the song with more confidence: "You have been faithful... You have been kind to me...You hold my future in Your hands...So, when the world's shaking...The ground beneath my feet... You're the solid rock on which I stand" and "I'll worship You...On the mountain and in the valley...I'll worship You...In the calm and in the storm. Today, tomorrow, and forever I will worship You!"

School Board, Highlights

JANUARY 15, 2024

- President, Quint DeGroot opened with devotions and prayer. All members present.
- Agenda for the meeting, and past minutes, were approved.
- Mr. Minderhoud gave the administrator's report for information.
- Education Committee reported on their December 20 and January 11 meetings.

- Staffing and planning for the 24.25 school year continues to be the main topic of discussion.
 Executive Committee plans on their regular visit with the SCS staff in February.
 Building Committee gave update on some items that are being worked on in, and around, the building.
 Motion to remove the pea gravel and turf the east side of the playground passed. The hope is that it can be done when they return to finish the original project.
- Transportation Committee reported weather related decisions in January and some fixes on Bus 17B. The state bus inspection is scheduled for February 7, 2024.
 - Weather-stripping on the bus garage has been replaced.
- Promotion Committee reported on the need to find a committee member to replace Kari Van Beek as her term is completed.
- Finance Committee reported on their January 4 meeting.
 The checking account balance of \$239,448.01. Sanborn Christian's average monthly expenses total \$87,225.57 for a 12-month period (July 2023 – June 2024).
 - Motion to approve the proposed staff compensation packages passed. Foundation reported on their December 19 meeting.
- Long Range Planning reported that accreditation surveys have been sent out and are requested back by the end of January.
- Old / New Business
 - Motion to purchase exterior and interior cameras (approximately 12 in total) was passed.
 - Discussion on what some remodeling of Jr. High classrooms could look like continued. Some quotes are begin obtained to explore the approximate cost.
 - Motion to approve Auxiliary's latest minutes passed.
 - Long range board goals and vision were considered for information.

 - Monthly prayer lists were exchanged among board members.
 Section 550 to 571 from the Board Handbook was reviewed. No changes were deemed necessary to those policies at this time.
 - Reminders of board visits and times were given.
- Mr. Anthony Minderhoud closed the meeting in prayer.
- Next regularly scheduled Board meeting will be February 12, 2024.

Our theme for the month of January is the Shield of Faith, and we are focusing on Ephesians 6:16 which says, "In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one." What is a shield? What is faith? How can the shield of faith help us in our daily lives to battle against the flaming arrows of the evil one?

In Ephesians 6, Paul was referring to a Roman shield. This was not a small piece of armor, like many of us may think. Roman shields were 3 feet wide by 4 feet tall. They were made of wood, covered in leather, with iron around the edges, and an iron dome in the center. Before battle, the soldiers would soak their shield in water. The shield would then be able to extinguish the flaming arrows the enemy was shooting at them. Sometimes, the soldiers would place their shields together to make a "wall" to provide additional protection. Without a shield for protection, a soldier would be vulnerable to attacks from the enemy, who look for weakness and use it to their advantage. Faith acts like this shield against evil and the attacks of Satan.

How would you describe faith? God gives us a description of faith in Hebrews 11:1, which says, "Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." It's similar to someone blindfolding you, leading you around a room, and then telling you to sit on a chair they know is there but you have not seen. If you trust the person giving directions to you, if you have faith in that person, you will sit down. We have faith in God, even though we have not seen Him. In Matthew 17, Jesus tells His disciples that if they would have faith as small as a mustard seed, they could move mountains. Everyone's faith journey needs to start somewhere. It needs to be planted, nourished, and watered, just like a small mustard seed. With time, and through the working of the Holy Spirit, we see it grow. The Bible says in Romans 10:17, "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." When we spend time in prayer, in worship, or reading our Bible, we are spending time with Jesus. We are hearing from Him, and our faith in Him grows. It may not be so obvious at first, but when we look back over our lives, we can see the gracious hand of God at work and see how we trust Jesus more and more each day because He has proven that He is faithful. Remember who He is and what He has done. Even though we are not faithful, God is ALWAYS faithful.

Think of the life of Job. Job lost his animals, many of his servants, his children, and ultimately his health as well. After all of these things, Job still trusted God and, in the midst of his grief, praised the Lord. Job 1:21 says, "The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away; may the name of the LORD be praised." Job used the shield of faith to protect himself against the many arrows from the evil one.

How can we be like Job and take up the shield of faith, even when life feels hopeless? How can we battle against the arrows of temptations that come our way? Satan's attacks may come in the form of lies, insults, or temptations. They may make us feel doubt, worry, or defeated, but we don't have to feel that way. Jesus' response to temptation was to quote Scripture. Three times He said, "It is written..." If Jesus was using Scripture to battle against temptation, how much more should we? This is one of the reasons it is so important to memorize Scripture. When we are tempted, we can use Bible verses to help us remember what God says in His Word and not the lies that Satan tries to tell us instead.

Sometimes fear and anxiety can crowd out our ability to trust in God's faithfulness. The truth is that no matter how bleak something looks now, God has a plan to work that thing for your good. This whole life is a rehearsal for the celebration we will have in heaven, so we celebrate now what God has already done, is doing, and will finish someday. We face struggles in our lives, but we trust God enough to praise Him and celebrate the outcome we know is coming. Even through death, God wins. We are more than conquerors through Christ who strengthens us. The victory is ours, but the battle belongs to the Lord. He has already won!

Preschool this year looks a little different! With 14 students, I have an aide (Mrs. Lori De Groot) helping me. Some of the highlights from the year so far have been learning about the solar system, decorating a box in our classroom to look like a gingerbread house, shaving cream letters on our tables, and a field trip to the Pumpkin Patch back in October. We are looking forward to transitioning to the New Testament in our Bible curriculum and learning about some of Jesus' miracles. 


