Principal’s Pen

Near the end of October, a committee of SCS members had a meeting with our CSI accreditation representative who re-introduced to us the accreditation process and thus marked another year of preparation for an accreditation site visit in the fall of 2024.

Accreditation is a review process that helps determine if our educational programs and systems meet defined standards of quality which have been set by CSI that also meet the parameters of the State of Iowa.

Therefore, Sanborn Christian School is currently a fully accredited non-public school that has met these standards of quality.

Accreditation allows us to receive access to busing, services from the AEA and the public school district, along with other programs. An essential addition to this list of benefits that we receive as an accredited school is the new Education Savings Accounts (ESAs) which have made a huge impact in Iowa since

January 2023. These funds would not be available to our families if we were not accredited.

Along with those tangible benefits, accreditation is also a way in which SCS is held to high standards of excellence and Christian education.

Over the next year, SCS will involve itself in a self-study which will be the groundwork for our accreditation. The self-study will allow us to thoroughly investigate, evaluate, and analyze all that we do in consideration of our own mission. The results of our self-study will eventually be the basis for our school improvement plan for years to follow.

Simply put, the accreditation process will help us measure our effectiveness in delivering on our mission. This process will be about much more than just a certificate for us to have and display. The overall purpose of this process is school improvement. We want to be better in the things that we do.



Accreditation will be the process that will affirm the many good things that are happening at SCS but will also identify areas upon which we still need to grow and improve.

In the fall of 2024, a team of educators will make a two-to-three-day visit to SCS to verify our self-study. Based upon the self-study, the recommendations from CSI and the accreditation report, SCS will develop a five-year school improvement plan (SIP) which we will annually document and submit to CSI. We will have from 2024 – 2029 to make progress on the SIP.

As we begin this monumental task this year aiming for November 2024, we value your prayers as we self-evaluate and self-reflect. Pray for SCS as we continue to properly understand our own strengths and weaknesses for the benefit of your children and grandchildren and to the glory of God.

School Board Highlights – November



November 13, 2023

President, Quint DeGroot opened with devotions and prayer. All members present.

Agenda for the meeting, and past minutes, were approved.

Mr. Minderhoud gave the administrators report for information.

Education Committee reported on their November 13 meeting.

Building Committee gave update on some items that need fixing within the building: kitchen hood fan, bathroom items, etc.

Building Committee reported that RPM will handle snow removal this winter.

Building Committee reported that some ventilation work is still needed yet to complete this project.

Building Committee reported that the turf project will be completed once the new slide arrives.

Transportation Committee reported on windshield repairs that were completed on Buses 16 and 17B.

Promotion Committee reported on the recent Harvest Sale. The new

auction software was used well. Checkout went much more smoothly this year. Initial reports indicate that this sale may be over \$100,000.

New, updated SCS website is up and running.

Finance Committee reported on their November 9 meeting. The checking account balance of \$287,155.64. Sanborn Christian's average monthly expenses total \$87,225.57 for a 12-month period (July 2023 – June 2024).

Building expansion debt is still at \$7,000.

Motion passed to investigate the expense of installing interior and exterior security cameras.

Motion passed to purchase new heavy duty resin chairs to replace the current supply of steel chairs.

Motion passed to investigate the expense of remodeling the classrooms east of the ramp.

Long Range Planning reported on the October 26 accreditation meeting schedule for October 26 with CSI. Preparations for this visit will begin yet this calendar year.

Weather-stripping on the

bus garage will be replaced.

Long range board goals and vision were considered for information.

Discussion regarding staffing possibilities for 24.25 were held.

Monthly prayer lists were exchanged among board members.

Auxiliary committee minutes were approved along with the motion to purchase new basketballs for PE and the upcoming basketball season.

Reports were given regarding October board visits to school.

Section 495 from the Board Handbook was reviewed. No changes were deemed necessary to those policies at this time.

Reminders of board visits and times were given.

Mr. Chad Van Beek closed the meeting in prayer.

Next regularly scheduled Board meeting will be December 11, 2023.

Classroom Spotlight – Mrs. Vande Weerd



Matthew 13:43 “Then the righteous will shine forth as the sun in the kingdom of their Father. He who has ears to hear, let him hear!”

This year our theme is the Armor of God, and this month focused on the Breastplate of Righteousness. The definition of righteousness, according to google, is: “the quality of being right in the eyes of God, including character (nature), conscience (attitude), conduct (action), and command (word). So, in other words, everything we do, say, or think should show that we have a righteous heart and show we are Christians.

A breastplate was worn in battle by soldiers to protect their hearts and other vital organs. The more we read about God and His word, the more righteousness we will have. This will also help us protect our hearts from the sin in this world. We can’t do good works to earn our way into Heaven, rather, we should do good works because it is right. If we truly have God and God’s word in our heart, we will want to do good to give glory to God.

In chapel we showed a black heart. That represents our hearts when we sin and don’t ever ask God for forgiveness. We also showed a red heart. That represents our hearts when we live a righteous life, and when we sin, we ask God for forgiveness and truly mean it.

The fifth graders were put into groups and were challenged to think of a song that fit well with this chapel theme and explain why they thought that song fit. I loved their songs and their reasons they picked, so I want to share them with you.

The first group picked the song “Be Like Your Father.” This song talks about how to respond to different situations in a Christ-like manner. Here was their reasoning for picking this song: “We need to be more like God and less like the world.” What wise words! This is easier said than done, but with God’s help and protecting our hearts with scripture, we can become more Christ-like.

The second group picked “Lord, I Need You.” This song talks about how we need God every hour.

So, when there is good in our lives; we need God. When there is bad in our lives, we need God. When there is contentment in our lives; we need God. The reasoning that this group gave was: “We need Jesus because we need someone righteous so we can be righteous.” Christ was the perfect example for what living a righteous life looked like. Without him, we would not know what true righteousness was.

The last group picked “They’ll Know we are Christians” as their song. This song talks about how in everything we do, people should be able to tell that we are Christians. I say quite often that even people driving past school during recess time should be able to tell we are Christians, just by seeing how we are interacting on the playground. This groups reasoning was: “Our actions need to show we have righteousness, and we belong to God.” We get the opportunity to witness to people every single day, but if we don’t show righteousness, love, or compassion, we won’t be leading others to Christ; rather, we will be turning them away.

The students at Sanborn Christian School have been blessed with many varied talents and the interscholastic speech opportunity is just one way to attempt to bring out those gifts.

Building Debt Update

We continue to keep in front of the society the financial end of this expansion. The total spent on the building was \$3,335,935 along with a \$200,000 contribution to the Foundation which brought the total expense to \$3,535,935 (not including interest accruals). NICSTO Tax Credit (Northwest Iowa Christian School Tuition Organization)

Explanation for DONORS

The state has recognized the need to support taxpayers who wish to support Christian education. Iowa taxpayers can receive a tax credit up to 75% of their donation that supports families who need tuition assistance and deducts the gift on Federal Income Tax. **How does it work?**

1. You must owe Iowa state income tax.
2. You must make out a check to NICSTO (Northwest Iowa Christian School Tuition Organization) and designate it to Sanborn Christian.
3. Complete the "Contribution Memo" and send it with the check to Sanborn Christian.
4. NICSTO will send you a letter of receipt for your Federal Tax information.
5. In early January, you will receive a tax credit certificate to attach to your Iowa tax form.

Example: If you contribute \$1,000 to NICSTO, you will receive a 75% tax credit or \$750 on your IA income tax. In addition, you may claim some of that on your federal income tax.

Your money will be used for families who qualify for NICSTO at Sanborn Christian School.

Would you like to have your Iowa income taxes go to Sanborn Christian to help with the tuition scholarships AND pay down the building debt at the same time...or for it to go to Des Moines?

If you have an IA income tax liability of \$750, you could give \$1,000 to NICSTO which would then provide SCS with that \$1,000 to be used for tuition scholarships. Then when you do your tax work in March/April, you will receive a tax-credit of \$650 from the State of Iowa. You could then give this \$750 refund to Sanborn Christian to help eliminate the debt on our school. Sanborn Christian benefits by \$1,750 through a \$1,000 gift: \$1,000 to NICSTO, \$650 to building debt.

For those who are at least 70.5 years old, we encourage you to give from your IRA (you may use your RMD) to NICSTO. If you give \$1,000 from your IRA you do not need to include it as taxable income on your return. SCS receives that \$1,000 for NICSTO tuition scholarships, plus you will receive a state income tax credit of \$750 that you can use to help SCS eliminate the remaining building debt. Once again, SCS benefits by \$1,750 on a \$1,000 gift!!

Really?

Yes! The NICSTO program has been around for years and has been a benefit to both the recipient (SCS) and the donor (you). **This is a great tax benefit to those who will be paying taxes on their income.**

Nothing in this policy, or any policies of the school, however, shall be construed to limit, inhibit, or otherwise restrict the genuine expression of our Christian beliefs or convictions.
