Principal's Pen

Staking is a practice used to anchor, support, and protect a young tree. It can be beneficial to stake a tree, and if done properly, it can help a tree stand while the roots are being established. This is especially true when the tree has only a small number of roots that have not yet spread into the surrounding soil. Staking can help a tree stand straight when it wants to stubbornly lean. Staking can also help protect the tree from the lawn mower and weed whacker. So, if your tree is young and exposed to high winds on a regular basis, or in a high traffic area, or is not standing straight...then staking may be a good thought.

The young tree in the paragraph above can be analogous to the young child within our home or classroom. Reread the paragraph and remove the word "tree" and insert the word "child" while remembering that "staking" is essentially another word for "supporting" or "anchoring".

We often refer to Christian Education as a partnership between home and school. We work together for the important work of anchoring our children in the Truth.

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge. Proverbs 1:7

We do that in the current times of high winds (Eph. 4 being tossed to and fro with every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness). We do that in the current times of high traffic (Matt. 7 - the gate is wide, and the way is easy that leads to destruction and those who enter it are many). We do it when our children may desire to lean away from the Truth (Phil. 2 become blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation).

The desire is to help our children stand while their roots of faith are being established and to provide them an anchor and support to help prevent them from leaning stubbornly.

A good demonstration of a successful tree stake is when the tree grows straight. Perhaps evidence



of successful anchoring of our children is their ability to live out their faith and indicate an active application of what they know.

I encourage you to ask your children and grandchildren these two questions this year: What was your happiest thing today? What did you do to help build the Lord's kingdom? You'll likely receive a variety of answers, but wouldn't it be wonderful if (when) the happiest thing of their day was the same as their "building the kingdom activity"? Wouldn't that be evidence of anchoring when their happiest moments in life are when they are involved in the Lord's work?

Often, the happiest moments of our days and our children's day, tend to circulate around ourselves unfortunately. Let's make it an intentional goal to "bend the twigs" so that they grow straight and tall, with roots anchored deeply in Christ.

Building Debt Update

We continue to keep in front of the society the financial end of this expansion. The total spent on the building was \$3,335,935 along with a \$200,000 contribution to the Foundation which brought the total expense to \$3,535,935 (not including interest accruals). The following is a chart to help you see the great progress that we have had in paying off this project:

NICSTO Tax Credit (Northwest Iowa Christian School Tuition Organization)

Explanation for DONORS

The state has recognized the need to support taxpayers who wish to support Christian education. lowa taxpayers can receive a tax credit up to 75% of their donation that supports families who need tuition assistance and deducts the gift on Federal Income Tax. **How does it work?**

- 1. You must owe lowa state income tax.
- 2. You must make out a check to NICSTO (Northwest Iowa Christian School Tuition Organization) and designate it to Sanborn Christian.
- 3. Complete the "Contribution Memo" and send it with the check to Sanborn Christian.
- 4. NICSTO will send you a letter of receipt for your Federal Tax information.
- 5. In early January, you will receive a tax credit certificate to attach to your lowa tax form.

Example: If you contribute \$1,000 to NICSTO, you will receive a 75% tax credit or \$750 on your IA income tax. In addition, you may claim some of that on your federal income tax.

Your money will be used for families who qualify for NICSTO at Sanborn Christian School.

Would you like to have your lowa income taxes go to Sanborn Christian to help with the tuition scholarships AND pay down the building debt at the same time...or for it to go to Des Moines?

If you have an IA income tax liability of \$750, you could give \$1,000 to NICSTO which would then provide SCS with that \$1,000 to be used for tuition scholarships. Then when you do your tax work in March/April, you will receive a tax-credit of \$650 from the State of Iowa. You could then give this \$750 refund to Sanborn Christian to help eliminate the debt on our school. Sanborn Christian benefits by \$1,750 through a \$1,000 gift: \$1,000 to NICSTO, \$650 to building debt.

For those who are at least 70.5 years old, we encourage you to give from your IRA (you may use your RMD) to NICSTO. If you give \$1,000 from your IRA you do not need to include it as taxable income on your return. SCS receives that \$1,000 for NICSTO tuition scholarships, plus you will receive a state income tax credit of \$750 that you can use to help SCS eliminate the remaining building debt.

Once again, SCS benefits by \$1,750 on a \$1,000 gift!!

Really?

Yes! The NICSTO program has been around for years and has been a benefit to both the recipient (SCS) and the donor (you). This is a great tax benefit to those who will be paying taxes on their income.

If you wish to donate, please fill out the donor sheet (included in the School Bell) and return it to SCS by **December 1, 2023**.
