Principal's Pen

Referring to the sixth request of the Lord's Prayer, the Heidelberg Catechism,speaks of our spiritual struggle. Its states that we need the Lord to uphold us and make us strong so that we may not go down in defeat to our sworn enemies: the devil, the world, and ourselves.

Although we have not referenced Q&A 127 at the beginning of this school year with our students, it overlaps nicely with our theme for the school year: prepare for battle by putting on The Armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-20). We are called to "be strong in the Lord" so that we can take our "stand against the devil's schemes". We are told that our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil.

In our opening day chapel and in our Jr. High devotions, I have attempted to clarify the difference between the physical and the spiritual. The physical realm makes sense to us as our senses help us understand things around us when we see, touch, smell, taste, and hear them. It is more difficult for us to grasp the spiritual realm as that is on an entirely different level. This is why referencing physical armor, or sporting equipment, can be a helpful way for our young students to discuss and visualize the spiritual armor that is listed in Ephesians.

While we attempt to bring understanding about the spiritual realm to our students, it is imperative that we all understand what Q&A 127 and Ephesians 6 tells us. The daily struggle is not, and should not be. with one another as Christian brothers and sisters. We are not on the list as one of the enemies. As the well-known hymn puts it: the Church of God moves like a mighty army. We are not divided: all one body we, one in hope and doctrine, one in charity.

The devil is a deceiver. He would love for us to question who the fight is really against. His tactics of doubt and misdirection are the same as in the Garden



of Eden when he asked, "Did God really say...?". He would love nothing more than for us to lose focus on the battle, and then to see the Army of God internally crumble.

I appreciate the medieval imagery below as it reveals many important aspects of being "one body". Taking up shields in this manner would certainly be effective in extinguishing the flaming arrows of the evil one.



Kingdoms rise and wane, but the Church of Jesus constant will remain. Onward, then, ye people! Blend our voices in the triumph song. Glory and honor unto Christ the King.

School Board Highlights – September

September 11, 2023

President, Quint DeGroot opened with devotions and prayer. All members present.

Agenda for the meeting, and past minutes, were approved.

Mr. Minderhoud gave the administrators report for information.

Education Committee reported on their September 5 meeting.

Executive Committee has the annual September meeting with teachers scheduled for September 20.

Building Committee gave update on upcoming playground renovations. Work on the removal of pea gravel and turf installation in those areas are anticipated for October. A few playground equipment replacements have been ordered.

Building Committee reported on the conference room renovations. Some ventilation work is needed yet, and we are awaiting new tables and chairs yet.

Gym rental policy for small SCS groups was revisited.

Bus inspection is scheduled for September 29, 2023.

Finance Committee reported on their September 8 meeting. The checking account balance of \$297,674.34. These funds include 94% of ESA payouts for the first semester, and the requested NICSTO funds. Sanborn Christian's average monthly expenses total \$87,225.57 for a 12-month period (July 2023 – June 2024).

Building expansion debt is still at \$23,000.

Two silage piles have been covered. Another two or three are possible yet.

Update on ESAs were given.

Promotion Committee reported on their September 7 meeting which focused upon Harvest Sale Auction prep. Auctioneers are Don Krommendyk and Ron Sterk. Live auction will begin at 4:00pm.

New website in still being worked on. There's hope to launch it in a few months.

Increasing the internet speed at SCS was considered and approved.

Hot Lunch reported that the milk machine has arrived. However, there appears to have a crack in the door which has stopped its anticipated usage for now.

Long Range Planning has a CSI accreditation meeting schedule for October 26 with the CSI representative that will be overseeing our visit in 2024.

Long range board goals and vision were considered for information.

New prayer lists were made available to board members. Those monthly prayer lists were exchanged among board members.

August Auxiliary minutes were approved.

A portion of policies from the Board Handbook were reviewed. No changes were deemed necessary to those policies at this time.

Reminders of board visits and times were given.

Mr. Jerry Hofman closed the meeting in prayer.

Next regularly scheduled Board meeting will be October 9, 2023. Please consider a financial donation to NICSTO!

Classroom Spotlight – Mr. De Groot

September Chapel 2023 – Training in the Lord's Army

We're back at it; the daily schedules of learning, extracurriculars, homework, and time with friends.

For some, it's exciting, even refreshing to be back into the "routine." For others, there's the daily question of "why do we have to do this?"

While there are many reasons for school, sports, and working through relationship highs and lows, perhaps the most pointed reason that God sets before us is for training. School is, by nature, a place of training. More broadly than that, however, Scripture suggests that childhood is a place of training.

Our theme verse for the month is Proverbs 26:6: "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." As we begin to dive into our theme on the Armor of God from Ephesians 6, I wanted to start where any soldier starts – basic training.

Before even gearing up for war or entering the battlefield in any real sense, it's first necessary that a soldier train. He trains with his weapons, he trains his body, he trains his mind, and he learns the skills that are essential to his survival on the battlefield. Once he is in the heat of war, surrounded by difficulty, and tired from the constant grind, he can rely on his training, even when his instincts might fail him. This is exactly what we hope for with our children.

Ephesians reminds us that our battle is not against flesh and blood, but is against sin, temptation, and the devil himself. This is no simple, easily mastered enemy! By God's grace, the victory is ultimately won, but this side of glory, the battle still rages.

Before throwing our children into the midst of this battle, we train them. Then, even when their instincts fail them, they can rely on the training from their youth: training in righteousness through God's word, training in trust through prayer, training in self-discipline by taking every thought captive to Christ, training in thankfulness through praise. Once trained, our prayer for our children is that they are equipped and ready for the battle that we face each day in a fallen world. Praise God, that the war is won!

In Jr. High this year, we jumped right in academically. In English, we've been writing letters, paragraphs, and character description while implementing our basic grammar marks.

In Bible, we've started our Old Testament unit with 7th and 8th grade as we see God's formation of all things and then the special covenants, He established from the beginning onward.

Computer Science has also gotten off to a strong start with building paper towers, trying out "blocky" code, and doing some reintroductions to digital organization. In each of these areas, we've been practicing our skills daily to train not just our minds, but our worldview and hearts as well.

As always, we appreciate your support, covet your prayers, and especially look forward to a great year as we seek to further "train up" our children here at SCS!

1st Grade Butterfly Tagging

Building Debt Update

We continue to keep in front of the society the financial end of this expansion. The total spent on the building was \$3,335,935 along with a \$200,000 contribution to the Foundation which brought the total expense to \$3,535,935 (not including interest accruals). The following is a chart to help you see the great progress that we have had in paying off this project:

Our unpaid balance is under \$25,000! We are very thankful for the financial support received <u>at this point in the project</u>, and we continue to ask that you continue to watch these numbers as we report them monthly, and prayerfully consider opportunities to continue to help us reduce the debt and complete this project.

NICSTO Tax Credit (Northwest Iowa Christian School Tuition Organization) Explanation for DONORS

The state has recognized the need to support taxpayers who wish to support Christian education. Iowa taxpayers can receive a tax credit up to 75% of their donation that supports families who need tuition assistance and deducts the gift on Federal Income Tax. <u>How does it work?</u>

- 1. You must owe lowa state income tax.
- 2. You must make out a check to NICSTO (Northwest Iowa Christian School Tuition Organization) and designate it to Sanborn Christian.
- 3. Complete the "Contribution Memo" and send it with the check to Sanborn Christian.
- 4. NICSTO will send you a letter of receipt for your Federal Tax information.
- 5. In early January, you will receive a tax credit certificate to attach to your lowa tax form.

Example: If you contribute \$1,000 to NICSTO, you will receive a 75% tax credit or \$750 on your IA income tax. In addition, you may claim some of that on your federal income tax.

Your money will be used for families who qualify for NICSTO at Sanborn Christian School.

Would you like to have your lowa income taxes go to Sanborn Christian to help with the tuition scholarships AND pay down the building debt at the same time...or for it to go to Des Moines?

If you have an IA income tax liability of \$750, you could give \$1,000 to NICSTO which would then provide SCS with that \$1,000 to be used for tuition scholarships. Then when you do your tax work in March/April, you will receive a tax-credit of \$650 from the State of Iowa. You could then give this \$750 refund to Sanborn Christian to help eliminate the debt on our school. Sanborn Christian benefits by \$1,750 through a \$1,000 gift: \$1,000 to NICSTO, \$650 to building debt.

For those who are at least 70.5 years old, we encourage you to give from your IRA (you may use your RMD) to NICSTO. If you give \$1,000 from your IRA you do not need to include it as taxable income on your return. SCS receives that \$1,000 for NICSTO tuition scholarships, plus you will receive a state income tax credit of \$750 that you can use to help SCS eliminate the remaining building debt. Once again, SCS benefits by \$1,750 on a \$1,000 gift!!

Really?

Yes! The NICSTO program has been around for years and has been a benefit to both the recipient (SCS) and the donor (you). This is a great tax benefit to those who will be paying taxes on their income.

If you wish to donate, please fill out the donor sheet (included in the School Bell) and return it to SCS by **December 1, 2023.**
